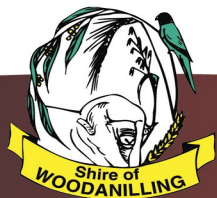

### What can be recycled?

**Glass jars & bottles**

Rinsed. Lids removed. No table glassware (eg drink glasses)

**Cans & foil products**

Aluminium & steel food & beverage cans, aluminium & foil products. Rinse cans & wipe foil. Attached lids are ok.

**All milk and juice cartons**

Rinsed. No silver lined UHT cartons.

**Plastic bottles, containers & lids**

Rinsed. Soft drink, milk & detergent bottles with recycling symbols **1, 2, 3** or **5**.

**Mixed paper**

Newspapers, cereal boxes, frozen food boxes, office paper, junk mail, shredded paper, magazines & phone books

**NO plastic wrap or bags, disposable coffee cups, styrofoam, polystyrene, batteries, nappies, garden waste, food scraps, paint tins, clothing, building rubble or kitty litter.**





# HOW DO I KEEP INFORMED?



**FIRES CAN HAPPEN SUDDENLY AND CHANGE QUICKLY, SO DON'T RELY ON RECEIVING A WARNING.** It's your responsibility to stay informed and alert. Be flexible – get emergency information from multiple sources and never rely on any one source of information. **Take these four steps to help you keep informed about bushfires and emergencies near you:**



## STAY CONNECTED

**Connected communities are safer communities.**

Join a Bushfire Ready Group to get to know the risk in your local area.

Keep in contact with neighbours, friends and family, especially during high fire-risk day.

Talk to your local brigade about how to prepare for a bushfire.



## STAY ALERT

**If you can see or smell a bushfire – that's your warning.**

Your surroundings could be the best source of information.

If you live in, or near bush, you need to stay alert. If there are signs of a bushfire you could be in danger. Act immediately to keep you and your family safe.



## KEEP YOUR DETAILS UP TO DATE

A telephone warning might be sent to your mobile phone or landline in extreme circumstances. This warning system (Emergency Alert) uses the address held by your phone company.

Keep your address details up to date with your phone company to give yourself the best chance of receiving a warning if one is issued.

Well we are happy to report that we will be moving into 2022 with a few more projects

We were successful in gaining funding to erect a bird hide and wildlife signage at Rushy Swamp for next year. We are currently underway with contracting and would expect action on this to be mid to late next year depending on when the edge of the lake dries out.

Along with this, we have also been successful in getting a satellite site for DPIRD pasture trials. We will be investigating certain pasture mix benefits for quantity feed gap in Autumn and the quality feed gap in Spring.

## Snake Removal Service

Now summer is well and truly here, we are seeing snakes out and about.

WWLZ now offers snake removal services.

Gen has completed training in venomous snake handling and has the equipment to remove snakes if you find one where it shouldn't be!

If you have a snake in your house/yard/shed etc. firstly restrain all small children and pets, if you can contain it in the location (e.g. close the door to the room and block off the bottom with a towel) do so. Do not antagonize the snake. Generally they will pass right by you if you do not move, (e.g. lifting your foot will draw their attention). Call Gen on 0428 231 506 and she will come with all the safety equipment and capture the snake. After capture will be released into bush reserve well out of town.

## Beaufort River Pig Problem

Those of you who are living over near the Beaufort River system may be aware of the increasing number of feral pigs being sighted along the river and associated wetlands and vegetation.

This week Gen went on the road to deliver some information packages to those who are situated around the river system, dropping off packages into road mail boxes.

Many people do not still maintain a mail box however, so there may be a few people who have missed out.

The info pack outlines ways to approach pig control and useful people to get in contact with if you need any assistance, and information about available equipment you can hire through WWLZ to help.

We are happy to provide this information to anyone who has concerns about feral pigs, just get in touch with Gen at the office and she will send you a pack.

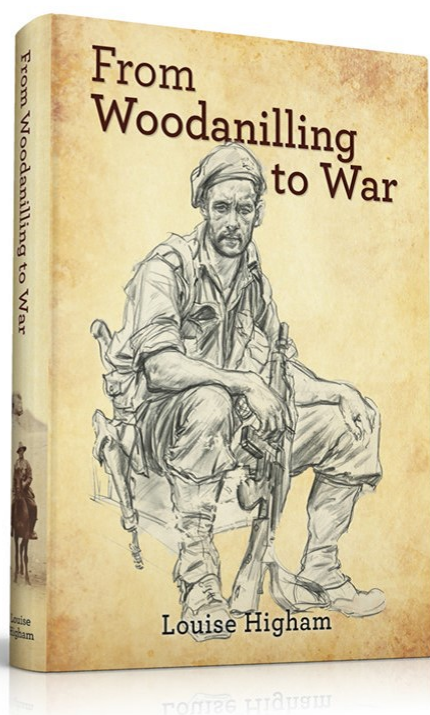

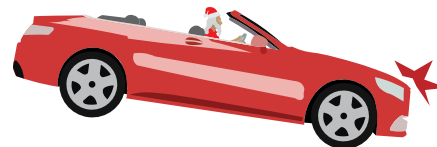
# Festive Road Safety: The Fatal Five

## The issue

The festive season is considered to be one of the most dangerous times to travel on Australian roads.

Each year people die or are seriously injured as a result of road crashes while travelling to see friends and family over the extended holiday break.

30 fatalities occurred on Australian roads in a 12 day period starting December 23rd in 2020.



## The Fatal Five:

Across Australia, the following total annual fatalities were caused by the Fatal Five

### Failure to wear a seatbelt

**156** vehicle occupants killed were not wearing a seat belt or restraint

### Fatigue

**240–360** fatal crashes were related to driver fatigue

### Intoxication (drugs and/or alcohol)

**94** drivers killed had a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) above the legal limit

### Distraction/Inattention

**300** fatal crashes were due to driver distraction and inattention;

### Speeding

**481** fatal crashes were caused by speeding

**73** drivers killed had an illegal drug in their system

**Do not become a Fatal Five Statistic. Be safe this Festive Season.**



Have a designated driver or use a car service



Plan your journey to avoid fatigue



Stick to the speed limit



Do not drink under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol



Do not send or read a text message while driving or better yet — don't use your phone.



Always wear a seat belt

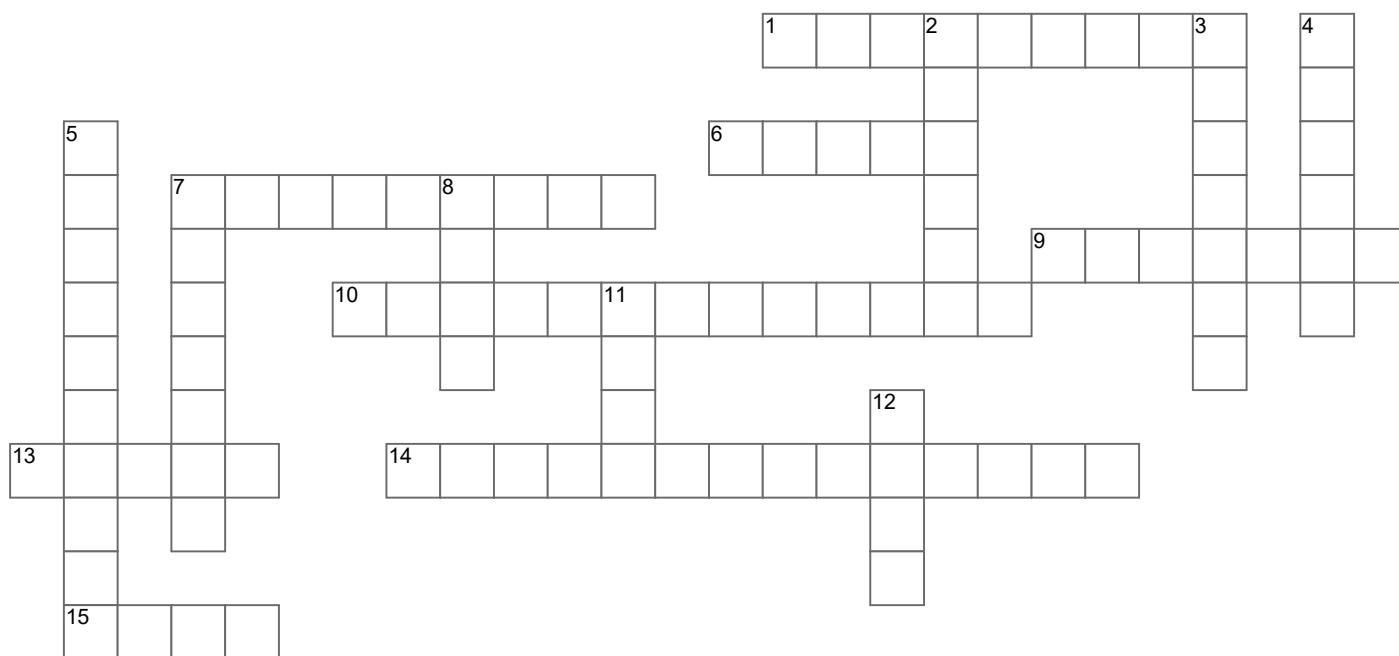
