


The Australian Fire Danger Rating System

COMING SEPTEMBER 1





The AFDRS will also introduce a new Fire Behaviour Index – a scale of fire danger that takes the latest in fire science and produces outputs across eight different fire behaviour models (compared to the existing two fire behaviour models). Providing fine detail, it will support decisions about fire preparedness and bushfire suppression.



This is a national program funded by the Commonwealth and all the States and Territories and delivered by local implementation teams. The AFDRS is being coordinated by NSW RFS and AFAC (the National Council for Fire and Emergency Services), with support from the Bureau of Meteorology.

A National Program Board, with representation from each of the State and Territories' fire agencies, is overseeing the program.

SHIRE NOTES

FIRE BREAK COMPLIANCE 2022

It's that time of year again and with the continual rain events property owners will need to remain diligent during prohibited period to keep their property fire safe. <u>Pursuant to Section 33 of the Bush Fire Act</u>, 1954 you are required to observe all requirements of the Woodanilling Fire Break Notice. If you don't have a copy of this document please call into the Shire office and you will be provided with one.

During the period from 19th September to 15th April all property owners within the Shire of Woodanilling are required to follow the directions of the Woodanilling Fire Break Notice relating to your property zoning. If you are not sure about what zone your property comes under please call the Shire office 9823 1506 and the friendly staff will be happy to assist you.

The whole of shire inspections will take place after the 15th November 2022. Fire Control officers will complete the farming property inspections and the Town site including Whispering Winds will be inspected by the Central Brigade Captain and a Shire Staff member. If you are unable to have your property compliance completed by this date you will need to contact the Shire Office and notify the Deputy CEO at shire@woodanilling.wa.gov.au. You will need to provide a date by which it will be completed.

Magpie Season

Please be aware that magpies are swooping at this time of year, so keep your head and your children's head protected. Wear a hat and put on sunglasses, even be prepared with an umbrella. Never deliberately provoke or harass a magpie as this can make them more defensive. Swooping season lasts around 6-8 weeks.

Fire Break notices have been posted out with each Rates Notice. Property compliance inspections are due to take place after the 15th November so make sure you have your property prepared.

natural resource management program

Pig control contractor—\$190,000 over 3 years

We are happy to announce that we have been successful with our last State NRM grant round and will be able to conduct significant pig control activities across both the Arthur and Beaufort Rivers over the next 3 years.

We have been working with a local contractor over the last few years on promoting feral pig awareness and sharing information, and we are now going to be getting Daniel on the ground for 6 months of each year for the next 3 years to eradicate pigs along the riparian zones.

The feral pigs cause significant damage to Red-tailed Phascogale habitat with their foraging and wallowing behaviour, potentially removing a vital food resource for the native



species in the future.

We are still going to be engaging with landholders as the pigs will take a lot more than 3 years to remove from the area with the massive increase in numbers we have seen in the last 3 years.

We would like to thank the State NRM Program for their continued commitment to State environmental projects.

Successful Nightstalk



Our nightstalk ran on Thursday 6th was a great success!

A heavy downpour just prior to us heading out saw a few people pull out, but the faithful that came along were rewarded with both a clearing of the skies, and an abundance of wildlife.

We had thermal cameras in use for this event which was a significant advantage in being able to spot wild-

life, though the distances did make it difficult to be sure exactly what we were seeing unless we could get up closer.

The group spread out and different people saw different critters with some scat hunters out and about too. (scat being the term for animal poo!) We ended up with quite a list of species viewed. Phascogales, several possums, several species of frog including the extremely chilled species Western Spotted Frog... (my personal favourite) who can grow very large and is not too perturbed about humans. We saw bats, a variety of interesting insects and in the river via the thermal camera, we saw what we hope was a native Water Rat (or Rakali) but couldn't confirm up close.

Following that we toasted some marshmallows round the fire and headed home. A huge thank you to our hosts Brad and Robyn Flett for allowing us to enjoy their land of Plenty!









Feed 365 Field Walk

On the 13th Oct we hosted the first of our field walks for our Feed 365 pasture demonstration site.

We had a small but engaged group of producers and industry personnel attending and saw some good questions come out of the group.

In the pictures you can see that we had more feed than we could utlise during this autumn feeding, and could have doubled the numbers of sheep that we had on the paddocks. We will be looking to spray top these paddocks to rejuvenate their grazing each site has a differ-

ent strategy for the next growing season, including re-sowing, harvesting serradella seed and adding new forage cereals.

used to make their coloured pattern paper. What are collage tools? How can they overlap a shape. How can they create a background and a foreground in their picture.


They chose between a seahorse, cricket or caterpillar.
