Lakes Action Group

Do you like to spend time around our local lakes systems? Are you involved in birdwatching, kayaking, skiing, hiking or any of the activities we can do around our lake areas?

Would you like to ensure our lakes are protected in the long term for both recreation and environment?

This group could potentially be involved in revegetation programs, fauna management, water quality or any number of activities that could benefit the chain of lakes.

Mosquito Management

With rain coming through quite regularly, it has been tricky to fit in treatment of the creek with larvicide. This product will not be effective if it is run through the creek in a new flush of rain.

Due to the high numbers of mozzies, the decision was made that we would have to go ahead and do a round of fogging as a short term solution until we could get a run of weather that would allow treatment of the creek.

The difficult part of the process is that the creek, whilst running, does contain pockets of still water that mozzies do harbour in.... But treating this with larvicide is challenging with the larger volume of water being in motion.

With the reduction of staffing on the Shire works crew, the task of treating the creek falls to Gen, currently treatment involves walking in the creek, the entire length of the creek within the township. When the water was running high from the heavy rains, it was too deep to do this..... Now the water has receded, but the mosquitos have had the opportunity to breed prolifically without intervention, hence the decision to fog.

Currently the plan is to allocate several days of the week of the 11th October to treat the creek and all standing water with mozzies present. The product works by preventing mozzie larvae from completing their hatching cycle, but does not affect the ones that have completed the final stage before pupating.... So even with this treatment, there will be some mosquitoes hatching that were advanced enough to not be affected. If we can follow up every 3 weeks as is required for management—without more rain— we can get on top of it.

But we do ask for some self management from you to help us and some understanding regarding lack of staff, weather restrictions and tight timelines for effective management.

Snake Removal Service

With warmer weather on the way (eventually no doubt!) and following the large volume of rain this winter providing a wide array of prey, we are likely to see a high volume of snakes this summer.

Gen at WWLZ has recently completed venomous snake handling training and we are offering a new service to the community to relocate snakes from your home back out into the bush.

Wagin is currently running a snake handling course which has been filled very quickly.... If you have an interest in completing such training yourself, contact Gen as there may be the option to run further classes.

Born 22nd March 1942 at the Wagin Hospital, only child of Olga and Wally Shaw.

Judy lived on a small farm just north of Woodanilling until her father started work on the Woodanilling Shire when they moved to Cardigan Street in town.

Judy attended the local primary school and when it was burnt down attended makeshift classes in the local town hall until the new school had been re built.

While attending the Katanning School she was seriously injured in a bus accident while in transit to school when she was about 9 years old.

Judy was involved with Badminton and played basketball in local teams during her years in Woodanilling.

While working at the BKW Co-op at Woody, Judy met John and as their friendship grew into romance and marriage, shortly after Cindy was born. John started his own earthmoving business and so Judy took on the role of bookkeeper, pilot, mum, while still working at the local co-op.

Judy always helped out at the local school, during swimming lessons, sporting carnivals and the likes.

Although not a keen cook, mums roast dinners where the best and being cooked in a wood fired oven always tasted amazing. Many of my friends and family have fond memories of those meals.

Wednesdays afternoons were always ladies badminton and although they were competitive there was always lots of laughter and chatter and fun especially when it was a social afternoon with another town, it was time to catch up on all the social news since last time they had last met. All of the kids would get off the school bus and hopefully get 50 cents to spend at the local shop on lollies.

Judy loved her animals especially dogs, we had numerous dogs over her lifetime, all were pampered and cared for in spectacular style.

Judy and Johns other passion was cruising, especially on the Princess Line cruise ships. John didn't have to drive, and Judy got to let someone else worry about doing the cooking and they both enjoyed seeing a number of different places over the 15 cruises they took, and spoke passionately about these trips.



Judy was a kind woman, who enjoyed a good laugh and if a cup of strong hot tea with a biscuit was involved, even better.

When the West Coast Eagles were formed, mum who had never had any interest in football before, became an ardent one eyed supporter, who would happily chat about the merits of players and game play decisions by umpires with anyone who cared to listen.

Judy and John were members of the West Coast Eagles and travelled to home games when work allowed, and if anyone rang when they were playing on the telly, don't expect the phone to be answered and if mum did answer it would be a brief conversation.

Judy loved living in Woodanilling and was reluctant to move to Katanning for a long time even though they had bought a house there. Even after they moved from Woodanilling it was still the place they called home in their hearts.

Judy loved her grandkids and when Darren was small and Cindy was still working part time at the local Shire office, Judy would babysit him and as he got older he would go with mum out to moved John from farm to farm.

After the Wade and Shaun were born, Judy and John regularly had the boys as they grew older come and stay the day or weekend to "help" Gran and Pa. They enjoyed many trips around the local area and around the Woody town site, even learning to drive out in the paddocks while Dad was working.

Judy was thrilled to become a great gran when Darren and Sandra had their two sons Tawanda and Tadiwa.

After John passed, Judy's zest for life and general health declined, until she could no longer manage on her own in Katanning.

She lived with Cindy for several months until Judy eventually moved into a nursing home in Albany, where her health failed and she passed on the 4th August, 2021.


