

FIRE BREAK COMPLIANCE 2021

Its that time of year again and with the continual rain events property owners will need to remain diligent during prohibited period to keep their property fire safe. Pursuant to Section 33 of the Bush Fire Act, 1954 you are required to observe all requirements of the Woodanilling Fire Break Notice. If you don't have a copy of this document please call into the Shire office and you will be provided with one.

During the period from 15th November 2021 to 15th April 2022 all property owners within the Shire of Woodanilling are required to follow the directions of the Woodanilling Fire Break Notice relating to your property zoning. If you are not sure about what zone your property comes under please call the Shire office 9823 1506 and the friendly staff will be happy to assist you.

The whole of shire inspection will take place after the 15th November 2021. Bushfire Brigade offices will complete the farming property inspections and the Town site including Whispering Winds will be inspected by The CBFCO, Central Brigade Captain and Shire Staff member. If you are unable to have your property compliance completed by this date you will need to contact the Shire Office and notify the Deputy CEO. You will need to provide a date by which it will be completed.

Pigs in Woody

We know that pigs are spreading out throughout the Beaufort River area. Did you know about the Hoggone boxes we have available for you to hire? This method of baiting is less involved than setting up and training for traps, however you do still need to do some luring to get them interested in the bait. We have 2 of these available to hire, and recommend using cameras to determine the numbers you are dealing with to make sure you get your baiting system operating successfully. (If pigs view one of their sounder members getting sick they will not take the bait, so important to get them all at once!)

We are happy to provide you with information and resources to use this method to accompany any other control methods you may be using. Get in touch with Gen at the office.

Fauna Surveys and Funding for habitat

It has taken us a while, but we have finally received our fauna survey licence so we will be able to go ahead with a survey program over the next couple of years.

We are keen to hear from you if you have a patch of healthy bush with some understory. We are trying to gain a snapshot of the smaller mammals that live in our area which are nocturnal and very flighty so unlikely to be seen without specialized equipment.

Get in touch with Gen at the office to register your interest. The program will also have funding for fencing and or revegetation so if you have a patch of bush that needs better fencing or would like to improve some existing bush, get in touch with us to organize a site visit.

Snake Retrieval Service

Over the years we have had the occasional call regarding a snake around the house.

Previously we have been limited with those who can assist in these circumstances, but now Gen has completed a venomous snake handling course and has the correct equipment to undertake capture and release activities.

We can remove the snake from your house or yard and will take the snake to a reserve location away from town, depending on the species as to where it is released.

If you come across a snake and you need help, you can call Gen on 0428 231 506.

Gen will be local on weekdays, but does live in Narrogin, so if the issue falls on a weekend, it may take longer to get assistance in Woodanilling, in which case, you may have quicker service from Nathan at Swags and Wags in Katanning.... However Nathan is a fee for service with vast experience, whilst WWLZ offers this as a community service.

Week 3 was a week for all things outside! The year 3/4 camp was quite an adventure! It all started with a blind rope/obstacle course at Camp Quaranup. All children were AMAZING at shooting and hitting the target, unlike Miss Nelson, who missed the target the majority of the time.

We started our second day off by exploring the water around Camp Quaranup. The children were climbing over rocks on the hunt for shells. Day two started with beautiful weather, which we made the most of by walking around Albany's Historic Whaling Station. We learnt how the workers would catch and tow the whales, using 100% of the whale. We had the opportunity to talk to and ask questions of a guide who worked on one of the Cheynes ships and had some valuable insights into his life. The weather began to worsen when we arrived at the National ANZAC Centre. All children were given a card of either a service man or woman and followed their journey of the Great War. We then braved the weather and went to find bunkers, trenches, coastal protection guns, and naval guns. To end the day, we all played some mini-golf and visited Three Anchors for dinner.

Our last day started with rain, so we packed and cleaned our rooms and made some kites inside. We took a photo of ourselves outside our home for the last three days and said goodbye to Albany. As Faith stated, "We are like a little family" it was sad to leave.

On the way back to Woody, we stopped and got some treats at Mount Barker Country Bakehouse, which we ate at our pit stop in Cranbrook, then we were back on our way home to Woody.



From Woodanilling to War is a collection of biographies comprising 220 personal stories of service in the First and Second World Wars, accompanied by more than 100 photographs.



They were ordinary people who volunteered for service when their nation called. They were wounded in action and suffered debilitating illnesses. Some became prisoners of war. Some never returned and lie buried in foreign soil or lost forever on the battlefields. *From Woodanilling to War* records their commitment and sacrifice.

Although its primary focus is on the details of military service, it is also a social history of the shire with the addition of particulars about each one's family and civil occupation.



Boyerine Siding Story: Part One of Two

About mid 1938 my 22 year old father and my 18 year old mother along with me as a new born baby in a pram moved to the then siding of Boyerine. With little money, a tent and a few basic camp facilities as my father had secured a job with the then -WAGR- rail and bridge maintenance location Boyerine.

A job doing anything anywhere during the Great Depression and the beginning of World War 2 gave little option but to accept without conditions.

My father came first and with no knowledge of Boyerine and what was available shops public housing medical etc. and not knowing anyone he was told do what you can there you're lucky to have a job and the rail ganger will contact you at the siding.

After arriving from Fremantle via Wagin with a free tail WAGA pass, my father set up a tent camp at Boyerine round pool and soon after started his job on the rail and rail bridge maintenance. He was lonely, confused and with no money and little food survived until his first wages came from Wagin or Katanning by the wages clerk on the freight train.

My father came from a failed Peal Estate land settlement property, his father desperately tried to earn a living, he walked off the property and my father stayed on milking other farmer's cows to earn money. On a trip to Fremantle he met my mother who was originally from Albany. They married and I was consummated and born in my grandmother's house delivered by the famous bike riding midwife - Nurse Fulton. After the Boyerine tent camp was completed my mother arrived by train from Fremantle with me in a big white pram carrying all the things she would need to look after me and my father not knowing what to expect and after paying her own rail fare with no one to help.

My mother like many other bush mothers had to quickly adapt to tent life in a semi remote location with no friends or any local knowledge on anything that would make her husband and me as a baby, liveable. Washing nappies in 4 gallon petrol tins, cooking on open fire and food management however they had fresh creek water. My father quickly adjusted to the lifestyle and made a "cool hole" to keep food away from flies and stable in a semi fresh state. He dug a hole and lined it with Mallee branches with a timber top covered with a wet wheat bag however they had a food delivery by freight train from Wagin weekly sometimes it never turned up.

They had no bed at this early stage and slept on the tent floor they saved and purchased a bed from Wagin. My farther could not read or write however he excelled in many hand skills that made him the rail bridge maintenance leading hand with no pay increase.

My parents were the only rail workers living a tent life at Boyerine/Round Pool. Others were local young men from farms or came by vehicle. Farm life at that time offered little return and many farmers and their sons worked on the rail.

My mother gained information that the little town of Woodanilling was just down the road and she could shop there, she packed me up in the big white pram and set off to walk to Woody little knowing it was about ten km's one way travel on wet wintery roads. This was to be her weekly shopping job and to find someone to check my health as the hospital



had closed, she shopped at Richardson's Store for most of the non-food items. Food and baby items came from the general store next to the closed hospital and rail from Wagin. She also found a nurse/hospital aid who lived in Woody and who offered her advice about my health and wellbeing.

After a couple of trips to Woody an old lady waited by a farm gate on a property on her way home along Burt Road and asked where she was from and what was she doing walking to Woody with a baby in a pram? Her name was Mrs Martin and she offered my mother to move in to her old farmhouse with my father as she thought a tent life for a young girl with a baby was not safe in all manner of ways especially all day in a tent by herself.

Mrs Martin had two young sons Harry and Jack both about my father's age there was never mention of a Mr Martin. Later in life I was told Mrs Martin had two more sons left behind in the <u>UK</u> who were eventually sponsored by my parents to come to Australia, this was long after Mrs Martin passed away.


I am told the farm was mixed with a cow and some pigs I believe my mother and I moved into the old house and my father repositioned the tent near the house where he lived and went to work for the next three years. Their meeting with Mrs Martin was the turning point in my mother's life, Mrs Martin became my mother's mentor in all manners of ways and the footprint of rural life for me.

My father continued to work with WAGR and helped on the farm with Harry and Jack Martin. They all gathered Mallee bark, trapped rabbits and shot kangaroos and sold all the skins to Richardson's Store. My mother and Mrs Martin grew very close like mother daughter. The group of men and my mother became a contract working team doing day labour hire, their speciality was sewing up wheat bags ready to go to Fremantle by rail. Mrs Martin looked after me and kept the food up to the work gang. Another name that gets mention is Milo Kealey? However at times a young girl named Lyndall worked part time and was Jack's friend and were going to get married. I am not sure where she came from, Woody or Katanning her surname is unknown and was never mentioned.

Sadly life was about to change, World War 2 had started and young farm men and boys were asked to enlist to fight and defend their country. Jack Martin enlisted and was sent to New Guinea as a young man. Sadly he never came back and lost his life fighting for his country. Lyndall never forgot him and was part of the family there after. Jack is remembered on the Woodanilling War Memorial.


He gave his life for Australia, his farming life and Boyerine never to see his loving Lyndall again. And now is in a lonely war grave in New Guinea that no one has ever visited and sadly forgotten.

By now my parents had purchased an old house in Fremantle and my eldest sister was born and all of our



My mother for a time used to travel by train to Boyerine to visit Mrs Martin with my new sister and myself. The farm was left unattended to Harry, Mrs Martin finish her life in Katanning with care from-Lyndall. Mrs Martin is buried in the Katanning cemetery.

I am hoping that someone who reads this may be able to answer my queries.



- Where was Mrs Martin's property location at Boyerine?
- Is there any local history of the Martin family?
- Who remembers Jack Martin on Anzac Day or any other day, he was one of a few who lost their lives for Boyerine/Woodanilling?
- History about rail gangs Boyerine?
- History Lyndall Jacks girlfriend?
- History Milo Keeley?
- Land ownership and rates payable Woodanilling around 1936 onwards?

I sincerely hope my family and the Martin family history has a place in local pioneer history.


