April has been a busy month, as President I've attended Understanding Financial Reports and Budget workshop induction with Councillor Smith. Having the opportunity to MC on ANZAC Day which was celebrated and was well represented by the community with a great turnout. Over 70 people attended Anzac Day in Woodanilling, whilst enjoying the CWA's morning tea after the ceremony.

Other meetings attended was the local Bush Fire Advisory Committee and visiting Gnowangerup for the WALGA Zone. Where the local governments representing the Great Southern Region meets to discuss the strategic directions. The opportunity to visit the other towns in our region, gives insight into the achievements of their current projects and what they are doing for their residents and ratepayers, whilst providing some great ideas for what we can do to enhance our own community.

It must be acknowledged that the new Town Hall ramp is now in its final stages of completion and will have the ability to allow side access with full ramp facilities for those that require them. Other areas of interest is that council is submitting a grant to increase the town water supply. Please watch this space as we progress through the grant application process.

COVID-19

Public health and social measures to ease

Thanks to the efforts of the WA community and based on health advice, public health and social measures will ease from Friday 29 April from 12:01am, as Western Australia's soft landing has been secured.



2sqm rule removed



Capacity limits removed



G2G Pass no longer required



Masks continue to be required for everyone aged 12 years and older (including year 7s) on public transport, in airports and aircrafts, hospitals, aged and disability care, and correctional facilities



Two visitors per resident per day at hospitals, residential aged care and disability care facilities, in addition, essential visitors also allowed at hospitals



Proof of vaccination removed from venues and businesses, but remain for aged care and hospitals. Mandatory workplace vaccination requirements remain



Close contacts with no symptoms no longer required to isolate, but must wear a mask when leaving the house, avoid high-risk settings, take a daily RAT for 7 days, work from home where possible, avoid non-essential gatherings and inform your employer

Autumn Fauna Survey Program


We have begun our fauna survey program for the Autumn period. This survey is aiming to get a better picture of what species we have around on private properties.

We have funding from the State NRM Office which is helping us to educate the community on some of the lesser known species we have out in our bush, as part of that funding, we are offering surveys on private properties to find out what you may have living alongside you!

We have completed 2 sites so far. One has a great population of Red-tailed Phascogales, scats and tracks indicate a good number of echidnas and possums as well. We didn't trap any of the lesser known focus species such as dunnarts and mardo, but the presence of Red-tailed Phascogales in this location, adjacent to a reserve surveyed for Phascogales successfully in 2007 indicates that this location has a robust population on land that is not currently managed for wildlife, which is great news!

We have had a break during Easter and Anzac Day, and will be back to it start of May. If you are keen to find out what lives around you, we can coordinate a survey on your place.

Feed 365 Pasture Trials

Sowing has begun on our Feed 365 trial. A plan has been established that will examine whether gaps in quantity in autumn, and quality in spring, can be improved through use of a mixed pasture/cereal program, which will be run over 3 years.

The plan will examine 5 options, each of which is a large paddock scale (10—25ha) plot:

- Intensive species mix (common vetch, serradella, forage cereals), dry sown
- Tedera perennial legume pasture
- Summer sown French serradella pod, dry sown forage cereal mix (triticale, barley, oats) before break of season
- Twin sowing of French serradella pod with cereal crop
- Control subclover paddock

Once Food on Offer (FOO) is assessed to be 800 kg/ha, sheep will be introduced. The number of sheep will be adjusted according to paddock area but be based on a fixed stocking rate of approx. 10 DSE/ha in winter and up to 20 DSE/ha for grazing in spring (the number of animals per treatment will range between 250 and 500). Sheep will be removed if FOO falls below 800 kg/ha.

Sheep measurements will be taken of liveweight and condition score at the commencement of grazing, after 6 weeks and after 12 weeks should sheep remain in the paddocks for that length of time. Date of grazing will be recorded for calculation of grazing days. Paddocks maybe grazed in spring if sufficient FOO is available, with similar measures of liveweight change and condition score.

Soil testing of plots will also be included to assess the status of biology. The Tedera paddock will take some time to mature before grazing can commence, so this is likely to be include in the 2023 investigations.

We will be hosting field days around this program, so keep an eye out for notification to stay up to date.

Weeds

We will be starting to see the emergence of weeds such as bridal creeper now that we have had a bit of rain.

The most common property weeds that folks ask about in our office, would be bridal creeper and cape tulip.

Cape tulip is still a little way off emerging, with 2 different varieties (one leaf cape tulip, 2 leaf cape tulip) found that erupt from around June onwards, but it does pay to be mindful before you see it and plan for it later in the year.

Bridal creeper has started poking its stems out above ground now, so it is a good time to note where patches are on your property and follow up when treatment time is best suited

Gen has an array of information in the office on best practices to manage weeds, whether you run a broadacre enterprise, or have an outbreak in your back yard.





AUTUMN RECIPES

INGREDIENTS

695g tub apricot halves in juice 4 sprigs fresh rosemary 2 tbsp French onion soup mix 1 tbsp extra virgin olive oil 1kg Chicken Drumsticks 500g baby potatoes, halved 1 red onion, cut into thin wedges



Step 1

Preheat oven to 200C/180C fan-forced. Grease a large baking tray with sides. Line tray with baking paper.

Step 2

Drain apricots, reserving 1/3 cup juice. Remove leaves from 1 rosemary sprig. Finely chop. Place soup mix, chopped rosemary, oil and reserved juice in a jug. Stir until well combined. Arrange chicken, apricots, potato and onion, in a single layer, on prepared tray. Drizzle over soup mixture. Season with salt and pepper.

Step 3

Bake, turning chicken and adding remaining rosemary sprigs halfway, for 45 minutes or until chicken is cooked through and potato is tender. Serve.

<u>INGREDIENTS</u>

1.3kg Australian Pork Belly Roast Boneless

1 tbsp olive oil

1 tablespoon sea salt flakes

1 tsp fennel seeds

1 tsp cumin seeds

1 brown onion, cut into wedges

1 fennel, trimmed, cut into wedges

1 cup (250ml) salt-reduced chicken stock

200g pkt Kalettes, trimmed

200g brussels sprouts, halved

3 tsp brown sugar

3 small red apples, halved

Step 1

Preheat oven to 140°C. Place pork on a clean work surface. Pat rind dry with paper towel. Brush rind with half the oil. Sprinkle with salt, fennel seeds and cumin seeds. Place the onion and fennel wedges in the base of a roasting pan. Place pork, rind-side up, over the onion mixture. Pour stock around the pork in the pan. Cover and roast for 2 hours or until pork is very tender.

Step 2

Increase oven to 230°C. Uncover and roast for 30 mins or until rind is crackled. Cover and set aside for 15 mins to rest.

Step 3

Meanwhile, combine the kalettes, brussels sprout, 1 teaspoon of the sugar and remaining oil in a roasting pan. Season. Sprinkle cut side of apple with remaining sugar. Add to kalette mixture in the pan. Roast at 230°C with pork, turning occasionally, for 20 mins or until tender.

Step 4

Arrange the pork, onion mixture and kalette mixture on a large serving platter. Thickly slice the pork to serve. and while the another second and property and white the world have seen and





INGREDIENTS

450 g Box Cake 180 g white cooking chocolate 2 cups icing sugar 2 1/2 tbsp boiling water 1 cup hundreds and thousands

MOTHERS DAY CAKE POPS

Method

Process cooked cake in a food processor until coarse crumbs form. Melt the chocolate in a heatproof bowl over a saucepan of simmering water (make sure the bowl doesn't touch the water). Stir until smooth. Add the cake crumbs and stir to combine.

Roll level tablespoons of mixture into balls, squeezing firmly as you roll. Place the hundreds and thousands on a plate. Combine the icing sugar and boiling water in a small bowl. Use 2 forks to carefully dip a truffle into the icing to coat. Tap forks on side of bowl to remove excess (you only need a very thin coating). Carefully roll in hundreds and thousands to coat. Transfer to a tray. Repeat with remaining truffles, icing and hundreds and thousands.

Set aside to set. Place in an airtight container and store in the fridge for up to 3 days.
