


The Australian Fire Danger Rating System

COMING SEPTEMBER 1



The Australian Fire Danger Ratings (AFDRS) levels are:



MODERATE

Plan and prepare

EXTREME

Take action now to protect life and property

HIGH

Be ready to act

CATASTROPHIC

For your survival, leave bushfire risk areas

The AFDRS will also introduce a new Fire Behaviour Index – a scale of fire danger that takes the latest in fire science and produces outputs across eight different fire behaviour models (compared to the existing two fire behaviour models). Providing fine detail, it will support decisions about fire preparedness and bushfire suppression.

The Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS) Program is redesigning the forecasting of fire by

- Improving the scientific accuracy behind fire danger predictions.
- Improving the way that fire danger is communicated.
- Providing government and industry with better decision-making tools.
- Reducing the costs associated with bushfire impacts.

This is a national program funded by the Commonwealth and all the States and Territories and delivered by local implementation teams.

The AFDRS is being coordinated by NSW RFS and AFAC (the National Council for Fire and Emergency Services), with support from the Bureau of Meteorology.

A National Program Board, with representation from each of the State and Territories' fire agencies, is overseeing the program.

Recent Maintenance and works on Roads in the Shire

Infrastructure works

The Shire Depot team have been very busy with preparing the townsite and road verges with spraying and slashing. Oxley Road Shoulder program has now been finalised. Further work is to be required to finalise the sealing on Oxley Road once the weather warms up. Maintenance grading works have been in progress along Onslow Road down to the Mission Road with further grading along Onslow to River Road. Coben Soak Road required urgent works however further review on the conditions on this site is required due to the nature waterway within the area.

Works are to commence on Cornwall Road, along with Shoulder works along Robinson Road West. The Shire has grants pending on road works to be done along Newstead, Burt, Orchard and Douglas Roads.

FIRE BREAK COMPLIANCE 2022

It's that time of year again and with the continual rain events property owners will need to remain diligent during prohibited period to keep their property fire safe. Pursuant to Section 33 of the Bush Fire Act, 1954 you are required to observe all requirements of the Woodanilling Fire Break Notice. If you don't have a copy of this document please call into the Shire office and you will be provided with one. During the period from 19th September to 15th April all property owners within the Shire of Woodanilling are required to follow the directions of the Woodanilling Fire Break Notice relating to your property zoning. If you are not sure about what zone your property comes under please call the Shire office 9823 1506 and the friendly staff will be happy to assist you.

The whole of shire inspection will take place after the 15th November 2021. Bushfire Brigade offices will complete the farming property inspections and the Town site including Whispering Winds will be inspected by The CBFCO, Central Brigade Captain and Shire Staff member. If you are unable to have your property compliance completed by this date you will need to contact the Shire Office and notify the Deputy CEO. You will need to provide a date by which it will be completed.

Thank you to the members of the 120th Anniversary committee, the P&C and school families for working so hard to plan and deliver the day, from catering and memorabilia to history books and promotion, it was an impressive team effort. LEARN, GROW, SUCCEED
At our 120th Anniversary celebrations, we announced our new school motto. It signifies the direction of the school moving forward whilst sustaining the current values of the school. The new motto will be gradually

worked into the school logo and marketing. Please see below the announcement that was made at the event.

While the passion for the school has been sustained over 120 years, the wider context in which it exists has changed significantly. The priorities of education reflect the priorities of the world it is in. This can be seen through the evolution of the school motto and its aligning vision. The overarching theme of our previous school mottos reflects the priority that is placed upon seeing students as individuals and providing education that meets them where they are.

The first school motto was "to each his own". It may have reflected the values of the time the school began, but was put up review at a P&C meeting on the 14th of August 1989.

The motto was then changed to "excellence through honesty". This motto reminds us that at Woodanilling Primary School, we align our actions with our values. If we act with integrity, people trust and respect us. These positive feelings from others and of ourselves then build our self-esteem, leading us to greater success in all areas of our lives.

Over the last few years, the motto has been discussed by the school community and the school council. The result of these discussions identified that it was a good motto, but the concept is a bit abstract for our early childhood context. Louise Schoonens, who was the Principal from 2017 to 2020, did a lot of work around this and surveyed the school community on the values we hold. Her work provided her a short list to work with and the new motto was refined from this list.

I am excited to announce that as a result of the contributions and work of the school, council and parent community, we will be adopting the new motto "learn, grow, succeed". This acknowledges that the ways in which we learn, the rate at which we grow,

BREAKFAST IDEAS

Children should eat a healthy, nutritious breakfast to give them the energy they need fo rhte school day.

Breakfast is considered an important meal because it breaks the overnight fasting period, replenishes their supply of glucose and provides other essential nutrients to keep their energy levels up throughout the day.

Ideally, breakfast should include fruit or vegetables, a dairy product (or alternative) and a wholegrain product.

Here are some breakfast ideas:

- raisin bread or fruit loaf topped with ricotta cheese and fruit
- porridge made with milk and topped with berries or chopped banana
- fruit smoothies made with milk, yoghurt, soft fruit and wheatgerm or psyllium
- wholegrain muffin (topped with cheese and tomato) and a piece of fruit
- yoghurt topped with cereal and chopped or pureed fruit
- baked beans with wholegrain toast and a small glass of diluted fruit juice
- poached or scrambled eggs with toast and a glass of milk
- · toast with avocado and a glass of milk
- wholegrain toast, spread with a small amount of jam or honey and topped with sliced banana, and a small yoghurt tub
- if you're in a hurry, grab a piece of fruit, a cheese stick and some low-fat crackers.
