Fire Break Notice & Bush Fire Information 2023/2024

Action is required by Landowners, Residents and Occupiers of <u>ALL</u> land in the Shire of Woodanilling

1.0 REGIONAL RURAL ZONE – OCCUPIED PROPERTIES

A <u>MOBILE FIRE FIGHTING</u> UNIT MUST BE EQUIPPED AND READILY AVAILABLE FOR FIRE FIGHTING PURPOSES

- 1.0.1 Immediately surrounding all homesteads, buildings, haystacks within 201 metres of a building, fuel storage tanks and drums, a <u>'Low Fuel Zone</u>' of a least 10 metres wide.
- 1.0.2 A <u>mobile fire fighting unit</u> on standby and available for fire fighting purposes during the period from 15 November to 15 April.
- 1.0.3 A mobile fire fighting unit shall be in attendance or close proximity to harvesting operations, straw cutting, straw baling & stubble related (eg stubble crunching) operations. The mobile fire fighting unit must be equipped and readily available for fire fighting purposes and trailers must be connected to a vehicle.
- 1.0.4 A fire access way shall be provided to all homesteads and shall be maintained free of all <u>flammable material</u> to a minimum of 4 metres trafficable surface and 4 metres vertical clearance.

1.1 REGIONAL RURAL ZONE - ABSENTEE LANDHOLDERS

- 1.1.1 Immediately surrounding all buildings, haystacks within 200 metres of a building, fuel storage tanks and drums, a <u>Low Fuel Zone</u> of at least 20 metres wide.
- 1.1.2 A <u>mobile firefighting unit</u> shall be in attendance or close proximity to harvesting operations, straw cutting, straw baling & stubble related (eg stubble crunching) operations. The <u>mobile firefighting unit</u> must be equipped and readily available for firefighting purposes and trailers must be connected to a vehicle.
- 1.1.3 A fire access way shall be provided to all homesteads and shall be maintained free of all <u>flammable material</u> to a minimum of 4 metres trafficable surface and 4 metres vertical clearance.

2.0 LOCAL RURAL ZONE

- 2.0.1 A '<u>Building Protection Zone</u>' is required around all buildings to a minimum width of 20 metres.
- 2.0.2 All Land in the Local Rural Zone is to be maintained in a <u>'Hazard Reduced State'</u>. If for any reason this CAN NOT be complied with, a VARIATION MUST BE APPLIED FOR as stated within this notice.
- 2.0.3 A <u>mobile fire fighting unit</u> shall be in attendance or close proximity to harvesting operations, straw cutting or straw baling & stubble related (eg stubble crunching) operations. The <u>mobile fire fighting unit</u> must be equipped and readily available for fire fighting purposes and trailers must be connected to a vehicle.
- 2.0.4 A fire access way shall be provided to all homesteads and shall be maintained free of all <u>flammable material</u> to a minimum of 4 metres trafficable surface and 4 metres vertical clearance.
- 2.0.5 LOCAL RURAL ZONE URBAN FARMLAND When the land is classified as Urban Farm Land by the Shire, the provisions of the Regional Rural Zone – Occupied Properties and Regional Rural Zone – <u>Absentee Landholders</u> will apply.

Bush Fire Act 1954 (Section 33)

Pursuant to the power contained in Section 33 of the Bush Fire Act, 1954 you are hereby required to observe all requirements of this Fire Break Notice. Please read carefully, these are your legal requirements.

During the period from 15 NOVEMBER TO 15 APRIL inclusive you are required to <u>have:</u>

3.0 RESIDENTIAL, COMMERCIAL, INDUSTRIAL ZONES

- All land within these zones are to be maintained in a "<u>Hazard Reduced</u> <u>State</u>".
- 3.2 If a dwelling is located on a lot, then in addition to 3.1 above, within a 10 metre radius of the dwelling you must:
 - 3.2.1 Maintain dead grass at or below 50mm;
 - 3.2.2 Removal of all dead branches from live standing trees or shrubs up to a height of 1.5 metres above the ground;
 - 3.2.3 Removal of all dead trees or shrubs;
 - 3.2.4 Removal of all branches from trees or shrubs that overhang the dwelling; and
 - 3.2.5 1 metre clearance is required around all fire wood stacks/heaps.

4.0 ALL OTHER ZONES / RESERVES

4.1 For all other Zones and Reserves in the Shire, the Local Government will determine individual fire control requirements by means of a Fire Management <u>Plan./</u>BAL (Bushfire Attack Level) Assessment This includes all reserves under its control via a Vesting or Management Order which may or may not be leased to other authorities, UCL (unallocated crown land), and reserves under the control of other authorities/bodies.

5.0 PLANTATIONS

- 5.1 A <u>fire break</u> being a minimum of 15 metres width shall be constructed along the <u>boundaries</u> of separate ownership, and all formed public roads, or on such alternative locations as may be agreed between the Local Government authority and the plantation owner.
- 5.2 Internal <u>fire breaks</u> between compartments of up to 30 hectares must be a minimum of 6 metres wide and for compartments over 30 hectares, a minimum of 10 metres wide.
- 5.3 All <u>fire breaks</u> shall have a 5 metre trafficable surface with a minimum vertical clearance of 4 metres to allow access by fire fighting appliances.

To reduce the spread of fire and provide some shelter, start preparing your property by completing this Property Preparation Checklist.



PROPERTY UPKEEP

Set calendar reminders to complete these preparations monthly during fire season.

Cut the grass around your property to 10cm or less.

Prune shrubs so they are not dense.

Ensure gas cylinders are chained/ secured upright.

Check gas release valves face

away from property.

Clean gutters.

LASTING PROTECTIONRURAL PROTECTION

Set calendar reminders to complete these preparations <u>annually</u>.

Keep gas cylinders away from likely direction of fire (i.e. where bush is) and turn release valves outwards.

 Remove shrubs, wood, mulch or any flammable material, against or near the house.

 Block any gaps under floor, in the roof spaces, under eaves, external vents, skylights, chimneys and wall claddings.

Install metal fly wire mesh on

all windows, vents and install a protective screen on evaporative air conditioner.

(Create a mineral earth firebreak

- along the boundary of your property.
- \bigcirc Install a fire or heat radiant shield
- such as a solid fence.

Complete these preparation<u>s **if yo**u</u> <u>own a rural proper</u>ty.

Make sure fire trucks can access and turn around on your property.

Check bridge loading and cattle grid loading for fire truck access.

Create fire breaks along paddock

Store petrol and gas safely.

- Install underground water pumps
- \bigcirc that lead from dams to the house.

If a fire threatens, move livestock to a-well grazed paddock.

Check generator and pumps are working.
