Glass jars & bottles Rinsed. Lids removed. No table glassware (e.g. drink glasses)

Cans & foil products Aluminium & steel food & beverage cans, aluminium & foil products. Rinse cans & wipe foil. Attached lids are ok.

All milk and juice cartons Rinsed. No silver lined UHT cartons.

Plastic bottles, containers & lids Rinsed. Soft drink, milk & detergent bottles with recycling symbols **1, 2, 3** or **5.**

Mixed paper Newspapers, cereal boxes, frozen food boxes, office paper, junk mail, shredded paper, magazines & phone books

NO plastic wrap or bags, disposable coffee cups, Styrofoam, polystyrene, batteries, nappies, garden waste, food scraps, paint tins, clothing, building rubble or kitty litter.






