MANDATORY TRAINING FOR BUSH FIRE VOLUNTEERS

If you want to join the Volunteer Bush Fire Brigades, completing the Rural Fire Awareness training is mandatory. Without this training, you cannot assist on the fireground.

Why Training is Required

The Rural Fire Awareness training ensures that all volunteers:

- Understand fire safety protocols and how to work effectively during emergencies.
- Are equipped with the knowledge and skills needed for fireground operations.
- Help maintain a safe environment for everyone involved.

What the Training Covers

- Fire behaviour and safety practices.
- Roles and responsibilities on the fireground.
- How to respond effectively in fire emergencies.

MANDATORY TRAINING FOR BUSH FIRE VOLUNTEERS

Any Fires lit are your Responsibility

28th February to 15th April - Permits are required for all fires lit during the restricted burning times and must be obtained from your local Fire Control Officer who will explain the conditions under which fires may be lit.

All firebreaks and fire hazard reduction measures had to be completed for all areas within the Shire of Woodanilling by 15th November and must now be maintained at that standard until 15th April.





RECIPES

ROAST PUMPKIN & FETA SALAD WITH HONEY BALSAMIC DRESSING

INGREDIENTS

For the salad:

- ½ a medium butternut pumpkin (about 800g), peeled and cubed
- Olive oil
- Salt & pepper
- 100g feta cheese, crumbled
- ¼ cup pepitas (pumpkin seeds) or walnuts
- A handful of rocket or baby spinach
- Optional: ½ red onion, thinly sliced and lightly pickled in vinegar

For the dressing:

- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 tbsp balsamic vinegar
- 1 tsp honey
- 1 tsp Dijon mustard
- Salt & pepper to taste

Step 1:

Preheat oven to 200°C (fan-forced).

Step 2:

Toss pumpkin cubes in olive oil, salt, and pepper. Spread on a baking tray and roast for 25–30 minutes until golden and tender.

Step 3:

While pumpkin roasts, toast pepitas or walnuts in a dry pan for a few minutes until fragrant (watch closely so they don't burn).

Step 4:

Make the dressing: whisk together olive oil, balsamic, honey, mustard, and a pinch of salt and pepper.

Step 5:

Assemble the salad: layer roasted pumpkin, rocket or spinach, crumbled feta, toasted nuts/seeds, and onion if using. Drizzle with dressing just before serving.
