HARD WASTE COLLECTION

11 and 12 August 2026

The Shire of Woodanilling will conduct a hard waste collection across the **Woodanilling townsite**. Residents must place all eligible items neatly on the verge by **6.00am on Tuesday, 11 August 2026**.

Collection times cannot be guaranteed, and each street will be serviced once only.

ITEMS ACCEPTED

- Indoor and outdoor furniture
- White goods
- Mattresses
- Carpet and lino
- General household hard waste
- Electrical items, including televisions and microwaves (**Please place electrical items separately.**)

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED

- Asbestos products
- Bricks, concrete, rubble or building waste
- Tyres
- Batteries
- Gas bottles
- Paint, oil or other liquids
- Flammable or hazardous substances
- Motor vehicles or vehicle parts

COLLECTION GUIDELINES

- Items must not be placed on the verge more than one week before the collection to minimise litter and maintain the appearance and safety of the area.
- Residents must place waste only on the verge adjoining their own property. Waste must not be placed on another property's verge, vacant land, reserves or other public areas.
- Property owners are responsible for ensuring their waste pile remains safe, tidy and secure until it is collected and does not create litter or an obstruction.
- All waste must be kept clear of roads, footpaths, driveways, street corners, street signs, water meters, water mains, power infrastructure and trees.
- Each street will be serviced once only. Items placed on the verge after the collection vehicle has passed will not be collected and must be removed by the property owner.
- Individual items must not exceed 2 metres in length, and the total amount of waste placed out per property must not exceed 3 cubic metres.
- Please allow up to two days for the collection to be completed.
- Items that do not comply with these guidelines may not be collected. Infringements may apply for unlawful dumping or non-compliance.

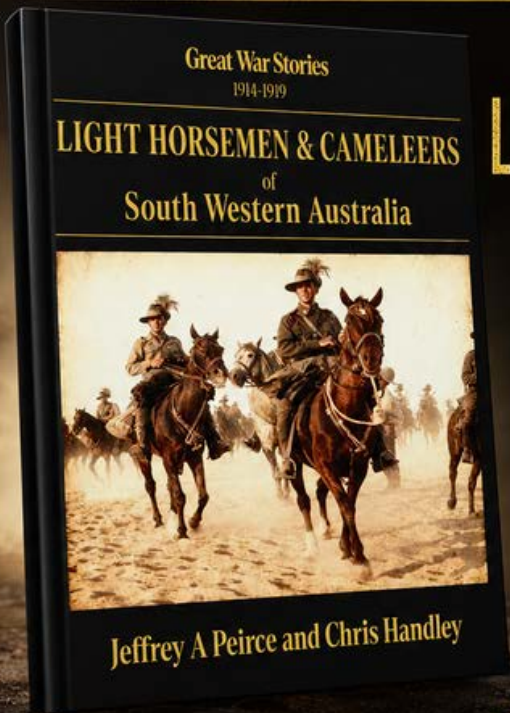

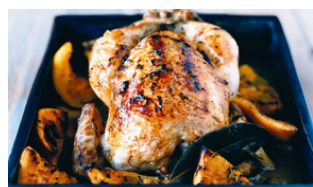


RECIPES

ORANGE CHICKEN

INGREDIENTS

1.8kg organic chicken
4 oranges
2 garlic cloves, crushed
4 rosemary sprigs
3-4 fresh bay leaves
1 cup (250ml) chicken liquid stock
60g unsalted butter



Step 1

Rinse chicken inside and out under cold water, then pat dry with paper towel. Juice the oranges. Quarter the juiced oranges and place in a large bowl with the juice, chicken, garlic and herbs. Cover and marinate in the fridge for 6-8 hours, turning the chicken occasionally. Preheat the oven to 190°C. Remove chicken from the bowl, reserving marinade.

Step 2

Place 2 orange pieces and a rosemary sprig in the cavity of the chicken, then tie the legs together using kitchen string.

Step 3

Season with salt and pepper, then place in a roasting pan with the remaining orange halves and the reserved marinade. Roast in the oven for 1-1 1/2 hours, basting occasionally with pan juices, until chicken is golden and juices run clear when a skewer is inserted into thickest part of thigh joint. Transfer the chicken to a serving plate and cover loosely to keep warm.

Step 4

Skim the excess fat from the pan juices, then place the roasting pan over medium heat. Add the chicken stock and bring to the boil. Add the butter, 20g at a time, whisking constantly until combined. Season to taste with salt and freshly ground black pepper, then strain into a jug. Carve the chicken and serve with the orange sauce.

Step 1

Grease a 3cm deep, 15.5cm x 25cm (base) slab pan. Line base and sides with baking paper, extending paper 2cm above edges of pan.

Step 2

Place condensed milk and butter in a small saucepan over medium heat. Cook, stirring, for 5 minutes or until smooth and combined. Remove from heat.

Step 3

Using a food processor, process biscuits until fine crumbs. Transfer to a bowl. Add coconut and lemon rind. Stir to combine. Add hot butter mixture. Mix well to combine. Press mixture over the base of prepared pan. Cover. Refrigerate for 1 1/2 hours or until firm.

Step 4

Lemon icing: Sift icing sugar into a bowl. Add butter and lemon juice. Beat with a wooden spoon until smooth and combined. Spread icing over slice. Stand at room temperature for 30 minutes or until icing has set. Cut into pieces. Serve.

LEMON SLICE

INGREDIENTS

1/2 cup Sweetened Condensed Milk
100g butter
200g granita biscuits
1 cup Desiccated Coconut
2 tsp finely grated lemon rind

Lemon icing
2 cups pure icing sugar
20g butter, softened
2 1/2 tbsp lemon juice
